We must learn that peace is maintained by the efforts of many predecessors, and how they have built peace.


Globally, some 250 million children live in conflict-affected countries and regions.

We will hold this in the International Conference room in the members hall of the House of Representatives which is used by heads of state.

At that place, multinational children will discuss "how to achieve peace on a global scale" and administer an oath.







We raise children who create peace by providing a place for them to plan, execute, and report on their actions based on that declaration.

Second, we promote peace education.

Currently, there is no subject of "peace education" in Japanese school classes.

In addition to studying the history of war in social studies classes and dealing with novels and poems in Japanese language classes, we will also work with educational institutions to create classes that specifically consider how to create peace.

Third, we will conduct enlightenment activities to increase the number of associates of this activity and recruit supporters. Creating an earth where 250 million children can live with peace of mind requires many people who understands and supporters. We will hold speeches at international summits and give lectures in various places to make our activities widely known.

Thinking about ways to achieve world peace with children from around the world

We are raising children who can act independently to achieve world peace. We define "world peace" as "the earth where children can live with peace of mind" and hold the Children's World Peace Summit as a place for children to independently consider ways to achieve world peace.

This Summit will be held the International Conference room in the members hall of the House of Representatives which is used by heads of state.

At that place, multinational children will discuss "how to achieve peace on a global scale" and administer an oath. We raise children who create peace by providing a place for them to plan, execute, and report on their actions based on that declaration.

Promotion of Peace Education

According to psychologist Erik Homburger Erikson's Theory of Psychosocial Development, the age of development between the ages of 5 and 12 is called the "school age."

During this age, children will be able to understand and judge good and evil, will be able to target and recognize things to a certain extent, and analyze them with a distance from them, a more differentiated pursuit is possible. School age are said to be a very important time to bring about growth and development to the mind and body.

During that important school age, children learn about the importance of peace, think, act and report on it. Such education raises children who realize world peace.





According to the theory of cognitive development by developmental psychologist and child psychologist Jean Piaget (Swiss), at the age of 7-11, they will be able to develop logical thinking skills and be able to think from the standpoint of others. Starting at the age of 11, they will be able to apply their knowledge and experience to make hypotheses, predict what will happen if this is the case, and act and speak.

In this period, which coincides with school age, we will raise children who have their own initiative to open up the future by providing education to achieve the following goals;

"Respect the traditions and culture, and develop an attitude of loving homeland and territory, as well as an attitude of respecting other countries, their willingness to understand foreign cultures and contributing to the peace and development of the international community." (Goal of compulsory education under the School Education Law of Japan)

To that end, we will hold the Children's World Peace Summit, promote peace education in cooperation with educational institutions, and develop activities to increase supporters.

In addition, in collaboration with the Hiroshima City Economic and Tourism Bureau, we donated 600 books as peace learning materials for school excursions, and provided e-books and learning PDFs. We also had a peace education discussion with students from the Kanto Gakuin University Faculty of Education, Child Development Department.

Creating Textbooks for Peace Education

After World War II, Hiroshima underwent a miraculous revival in mental way and living environment aspects.

The women in Hiroshima survived moving forward strongly and lived positively with a mind of forgiveness, without having a grudge against or hating someone. We published their story in comics and made it a peace education textbook.

This manga will foster children who will creating the future through the history of Hiroshima revival. Through learning reconstruction history, children will respect the traditions and culture, and get an attitude of loving homeland and territory, as well as an attitude of respecting other countries, their willingness to understand foreign cultures and contributing to the peace and development of the international community.




President Obama is impressed by reading The Hiroshima Miracle"!

My great-grandmother also experienced war. She died this year, but before the meal, she put her palms together and bowed deeply for a long time, and after the meal she was doing the same as before the meal. She did it every day and she was grateful for many things. That figure overlapped with Taeko's great-grandmother and I was very impressed.

Manga seeks to counter gloomy stereotypes

Hiroshima survival one of joy, artist says

The horror in post-bombing Hiroshima is captured in black-and-white photos of the city and its beleaguered survivors.

But Taeko Tada, whose mother survived the U.S. atomic bombing at the age of 5, has a different take on the tragedy. Her self-published manga focuses on the happier faces of women who let go of their pain, decided to forgive and helped to rebuild the city.

Tada's great-grandmother lost her daughter-in-law at age 56 due to the effects of the atomic bomb and raised Tada's mother alone.

Tada released the manga in Japanese in five booklets last year, to mark 70 years since the end of World War II. It was printed in English in March and will be available on iBooks.

The book was sent to American Ambassador Caroline Kennedy, who in April wrote a letter of thanks. Kennedy said a copy will be sent to Washington.

In her letter, Kennedy said she was "deeply moved" by her visits to Hiroshima and Nagasaki, and said she hopes the visits will "help to advance President (Barack) Obama's goal of realizing a world without nuclear weapons."

touched" by Obama's speech during his historic visit Friday to Hiroshima as the first sitting U.S. president to do so, especial ly since he mentioned a story about forgiveness, a theme that reverberates in her manga.

In his address, Obama spoke of a woman who forgave the pilot who flew the plane that dropped the bomb "because she recognized what she really hated was war itself."

Tada's 172-page book features her great-grandmother's ordeal in the aftermath of the bombing. Tada said she was very young when her great-grandmother died but vividly recalls her inspiring words about how it is better to forgive than to be stuck in the past.

The manga also features the story of a mother who cheered on a struggling baseball team in Hiroshima in honor of her son and a woman who was known as one of the "Hiroshima Maidens" invited to the United States for reconstructive surgery.

Recounting her experience in high school, Tada said she was shocked when, as a volunteer guide for foreign visitors, she was asked if the people in Hiro-shima still hated Americans.

"(The) atomic bombing is a serious subject and sometimes discourages people to come here. People feel heavy after touring through the Peace Memorial Park and other atomic bomb-related sites," she said.

She said her manga received positive feedback from atomic bomb survivors, who thanked her for sharing sentiments they could not quite articulate.

"We cannot live in the past. We cannot change what hap-pened," Tada said. Her mes-sage is to live toward the future: This is the Hiroshima I want people to know."
